

Meigs Academic Magnet Grading For Learning Policies 2014-2015

The method of determining grades is uniform across all subjects and teachers. Grades will reflect student mastery of grade level content standards. A separate grade will be given in each subject for overall effort using the effort rubric (see back).

Academic grades will be based on work products that address grade level standards. Categories in Grade Speed will mirror the standards. Within each category, grades shall be determined and recorded using multiple forms of <u>summative assessments</u> including, but not limited to-projects/presentations, performance tasks, tests/quizzes, portfolio assessments, and written performance.

Retakes:

- Retakes are available for summative assessments.
- When students complete a retake, the MOST RECENT RETAKE GRADE is the grade that will count in Grade Speed.
- Once a graded assessment is returned to students, any retakes must be taken by the
 next available "Retake/Enrichment Wednesday". This will occur every two weeks.
 However, students and teachers may arrange individually to schedule retakes at times
 prior to the Retake Wednesday.
- If a teacher hands back a graded summative assessment to students on the same week as the Retake/Enrichment Wednesday, the student has the option of retake the assessment on the NEXT scheduled Retake Wednesday.
- Before students are allowed to sign up for retakes, they must complete a Retake Form. This form asks students to analyze their mistakes and will help them in preparing for the retake.
- There is a maximum of two retakes for any assessment. Students will follow the same process if they wish to retake a second time.

Missing Assessments:

• If a student does not complete a summative assessment (test, quiz, portfolio, essay, project), it must be "resolved" within 5 school days. Parents will be notified of the missing summative and after 5 days, the missing grade will convert to a 50% in Grade Speed. Extensions may be granted by teachers for legitimate reasons like an extended illness.

Effort Grades:

- A "Student Professionalism & Effort" category has been added to each student's grade book for each subject. Effort grades will be recorded using the school wide "Student Professionalism & Effort" recording sheet.
- An effort grade will be recorded in Grade Speed weekly based on the average effort score for that sheet.
