Hammurabi's laws

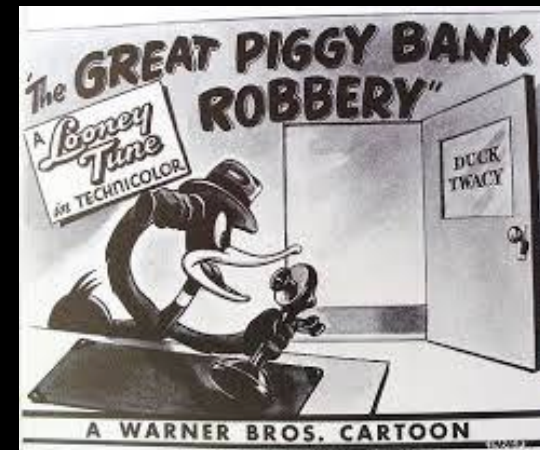
Man he had some very harsh laws!

(I will never play around with my dad again with hitting!)

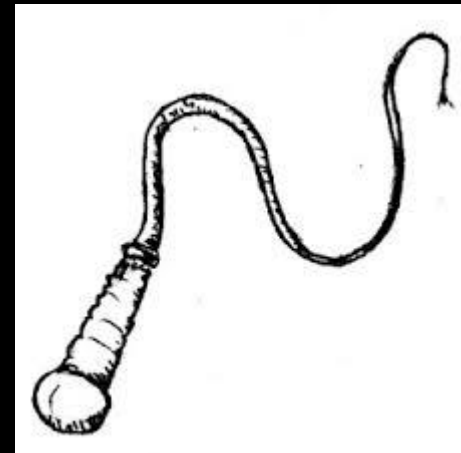


Look now he has even more harsh laws!
